# **Your Immune System In Space**

Getting sick when you're far from home is a drag. You'd give anything to crawl ito your own soft bed and sleep. But you're stuck in a cookie-cutter hotel room feeling like a sick fish out of water. Well, it could be worse.

You could be an astronaut on the way to Mars—a really long way from mom's chicken soup.

Future space travelers will need to stay healthy to perform well for their own safety and for mission success. So it's important to understand how extended space travel will affect them.

Factors like radiation, microgravity stress, and altered sleep cycles could all affect astronaut's immune systems. A new NASA study will investigate the immune system changes that occur in the Internation Space Station's crew members. Understanding these immune system changes may heop scientists pinpoint the onset of illness and suggest monitoring strategies or treatments that can boost the immune system and prevent full-blown infections and diseases here on Earth.

Military Intelligence Group: OIC, VMA-333 "Phoenix Squadron"

Greetings, Marines!

(Please read all the way through this.)

For those of you who haven't been paying attention, you may notice that we're no longer on one of the USS Regulator's flight decks. This is because Phoenix Squadron has closed, and instead of being yet another Aerospace squadron, we are now a Support Branch unit: specifically, a Military Intelligence Group. Come on in, and let me give everyone the fifty-centicredit tour.

(This tour is UNCLASSIFIED, and the spaces you're visiting have been sanitized for public viewing. No classified document has been harmed in the production of this tour.)

First, to answer the question of "why did the Marines change branches?" The short answer: "because."

The longer and more thorough answer: I felt as though we had become a bit stale. Our Marine unit has changed branches before... in fact, when the ship was the *Galaxy*-class USS *Comanche*, the Marine unit was an Aerospace squadron, and when I joined the ship (while it was the *Achilles*-class USS *Regulator*), it was a MECHA unit. After I became Captain (the first time around), we changed it


to Phoenix Squadron in Aerospace (again – not knowing that it had been an Aerospace squadron in the past). It was fun for a while, but I was getting bored with it. We visited the occasional aircraft museum, and the occasional air show, but after you've done the same thing over and over again, something new is in order. I asked everyone to think about a change. (see last month's issue, for example.)

I studied upon the idea myself, and re-read various Branch manuals, and found myself drawn over-and-over to Military Intelligence, in the Support Branch. Many of you may remember that my rating in the United States Navy was Intelligence Specialist, so I have the real-world knowledge (as well as a fair amount of nostalgia, as the years have passed.) With my more-than-passing interest in having ship-wide roleplay opportunities, I realized that having a forward-deployed Intelligence Center, similar to where I worked at CINCUSNAVEUR but instead on a heavily armed Ship of the Line like our current *Excelsior*-class USS *Regulator*, provided a wealth of such roleplay possibilities.

To flesh out this concept, I wrote up a brief description of the organization of the 333<sup>rd</sup> as a Military Intelligence Group (or, MILINTGRU). The 333<sup>rd</sup> MILINTGRU is company-sized, and is organized into five platoons:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Platoon (Operations)
  - Electronic Intelligence (ELINT) gathers electronic data (scanner emissions, energy profiles, etc.) using ship's sensors, remote satellites, probes, long-range sensors, drones, aerospace craft, and special sources
  - Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) gathers signals data (intercepted communications) using ship's sensors, remote satellites, probes, long-range sensors, drones, aerospace craft, and special sources
  - o Cryptography Decodes intercepted communications to permit analysis.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Platoon (Operations)
  - Lifeform Intelligence (LINT) gathers information from various life-form sources interviews, interrogations, spies, the press, informants, etc. (what used to be called HUMINT in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century)
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Platoon (Imagery)
  - "Imagery Intelligence (IMINT)" gathers images from ship's sensors, remote satellites, long-range sensors, drones, aerospace craft, and special sources
- 4<sup>th</sup> Platoon (Tactical & Strategic Analysis)
  - Interprets raw data from various sources, identifies trends, deduces probable future developments and actions of the target based on historical tendencies, the target's established behavior patterns, military doctrine, and culture.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Platoon (Geopolitical Intelligence)

 Using data from a wide selection of sources (including but not limited to SIGINT, ELINT, LINT, Imagery, and open sources like the press), analyzes current events of military, political, industrial, and cultural natures, determining trends and likely developments and their relative importance, as well as the impact these events are likely to have on




### Federation interest.

The unit, of course, has a new nickname, as suggested by LTC Roon Marchant: "The Yellowjackets." (The Branch color for Support Branch is "Starfleet Gold," the mustard-yellow color worn by engineers, security, and tactical folks in the Next Generation.) The nickname lends itself to a mascot of a yellowjacket, that I believed should be holding a magnifying glass (in a nod to the US Navy's Intelligence Specialist rating badge, which is a crossed magnifying glass and quill pen.) Suggesting this on a thread on Facebook prompted COL Brian Allen, the 3BDE S-3 and the SFMC's COFORCECOM, to create a picture of said mascot (who, in my head at least, I call Jack):

I came up with a new motto/slogan: "We Know Better". This is, of course, a bit of a play on words... the first meaning is that we, as an Intelligence unit, have better knowledge of what's going on in the galaxy; and the second is that we do whatever we're doing even though we know better than to do it.

So, what should we, as the newly-minted Intelligence Group that we are, do? Here's my first idea: 3<sup>rd</sup>

Now, on with the game stuff...

I was looking through my hoard (again, it's not a collection, it's a hoard... collections are organized) a while ago, and I saw the Discworld Role Playing Game. Discworld, if you don't know, is a fantasy world created by the late Sir Terry Pratchett, first appearing in the early 1980's in the novel The Colour of Magic. It's a flat world, a disc, that rests on the back of four elephants, who stand on the back of Great A'Tuin, a turtle. The world has changed significantly since he first wrote about it – the last novel in the series that I read, entitled "Raising Steam", tells about the first railway on the Disc – and the fight some Dwarfs put up against it.

The RPG, like many I own, is a bit dated. This edition doesn't include, nor refer to, about half of the series. It's written using the third edition of the GURPS rules, and includes a "lite" version thereof. To get the most out of the game, though, I'd suggest using the full GURPS rules. GURPS stands for Generic Universal Role Playing System, and it's published by Steve Jackson Games (the same folks who make Munchkin, amongst other great stuff.)

The game system is thorough. You can, given enough character points, make ANY character you wish, from any time you wish. Want an elf wizard? (The Discworld doesn't have 'em, but other fantasy universes do.) No problem. Want a cyborg? Ok. A superhero? Can do. A Roman gladiator, an Egyptian priest of Set, a Viking raider, an Old West gunfighter, a Discworld werewolf? No problems. Of course, this thoroughness comes at a price: character creation is fairly slow, very meticulous, and involves math. Lots of math.

Grab some dice, and let's start killin' some goblins – ... Sum non Satis?
